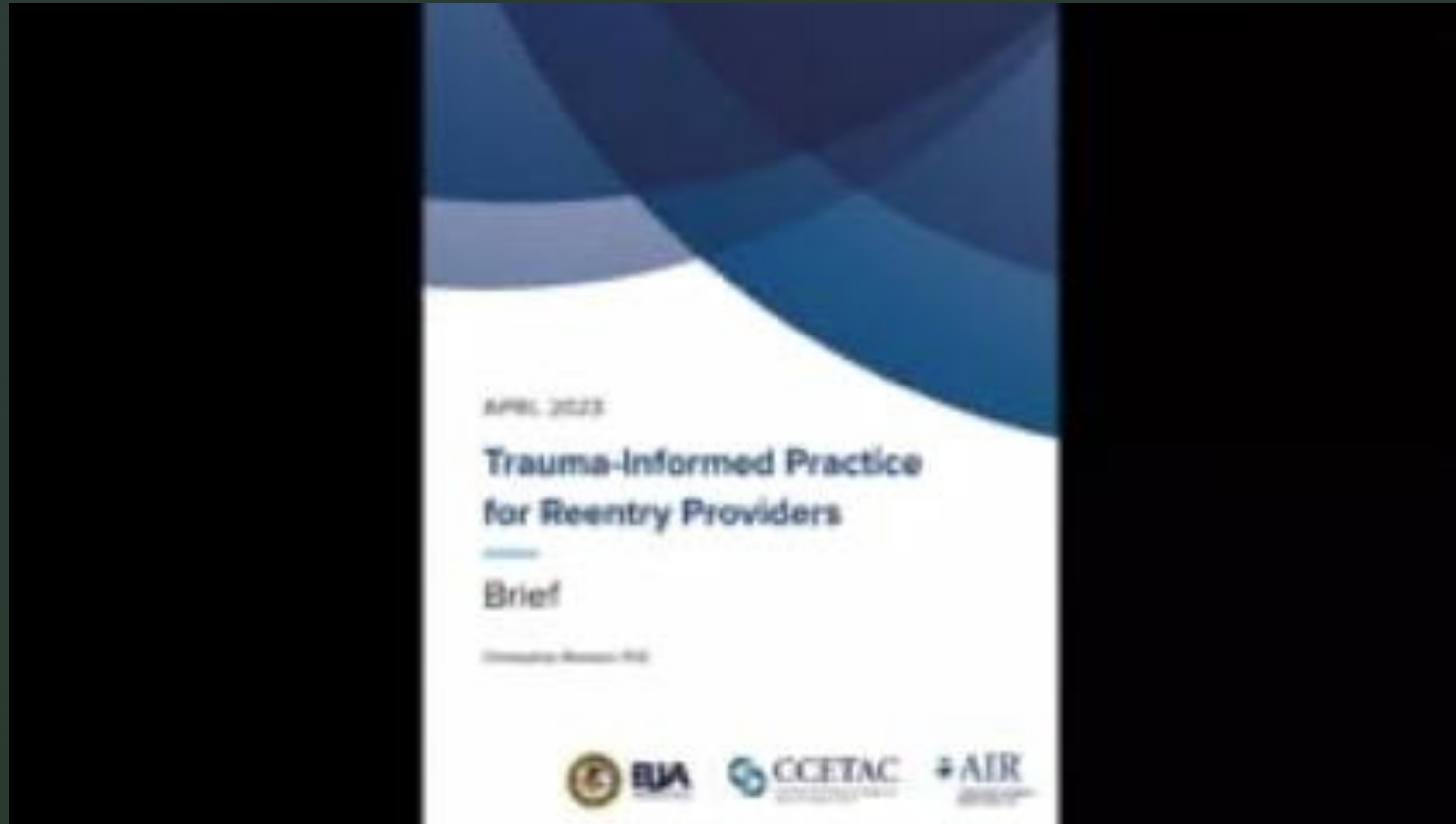

▶ Moving toward a Reentry Ecosystem in Central Ohio and beyond

- Funding to support successful reentry must take into account the capacity and operations of community organizations.
